## Fabric Requirements

21⁄3 yards (20 full picture squares) Sue-C4453 Black 1¼ yards Sue-C4454 Natural
1/3 yard Sue-C4568 Black
21⁄3 yards Studio-C3096 Cream
5/8 yard Studio-C3096 Pine
$11 / 2$ yards Studio-C3096 Spruce (includes binding)
3 yards Sue-C4455 Natural
8 yards backing fabric of your choice
$96 " \times 112$ " batting

## Cutting

From Sue-C4453 Black:

- Fussy-cut twenty 11" squares, centering the design motif in each.
From Sue-C4454 Natural:
- Cut ten 4" x width-of-fabric (WOF) strips. Sub-cut forty 4" x 10 " strips.
From Sue-C4568 Black:
- Cut two 4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut twenty 4" squares.

From Studio-C3096 Cream:

- Cut thirty-eight $1 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips. Sub-cut forty $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $16^{1 / 2 "}$ strips, forty $1 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 11$ " strips and eighty $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 4$ " strips. -Cut eight 1 " xWOF strips. Sub-cut fifteen 1 " x $161 / 2$ " sashing strips.
- Cut ten 1" xWOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end using diagonal seams. Sub-cut six 1" x 66" sashing strips.
- Cut five 1 " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end using diagonal seams. Sub-cut two $1^{\prime \prime} \times 83^{1 / 2 "}$ side border strips.
From Studio-C3096 Pine:
- Cut ten $13 / 4$ " xWOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end using diagonal seams. Sub-cut two $13 / 4$ " x 106 " inner side borders and two $13 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 891 / 2^{"}$ inner top/bottom borders.
From Studio-C3096 Spruce:
- Cut ten $2 \frac{1}{2}$ " xWOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end using diagonal seams. Sub-cut two $1 \frac{3}{4} 4^{\prime \prime} \times 106^{\prime \prime}$ middle side borders and two $13 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 899^{1 / 2}$ " middle top/bottom borders.
- Cut ten $2 \frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF binding strips.

From Sue-C4455 Natural:
Refer to the quilt photo for stripe positioning.

- Fussy-cut two 7½"x 106" length-of-fabric (LOF) outer side borders.
- Fussy-cut two 7½"x 89½" LOF outer top/bottom borders.

Block Construction

1. Sew a $1^{1 ⁄ 2}$ " x 4 " C3096 Cream strip to one short side of a 4 " x 10" C4454 Natural strip. Sew a $1 \frac{1}{2}{ }^{\prime \prime}$ x $11^{\prime \prime}$ C3096 Cream strip to the top and

fig. 1-Make 20. and another to the bottom of each unit. (figure 1) Repeat to make a total of twenty units.
2. Sew a $1^{1} 1^{\prime \prime} \times 4$ 4" C3096 Cream strip to each short end of the remaining twenty $4 " \times 10$ " C4454 Natural strips.

## Quilt Top Assembly

6. Following the Quilt Assembly Diagram for block placement and orientation, lay out the blocks in five rows of four blocks each. For rows 1, 3 and 5, alternate Blocks A and B with 1" x $16^{1} / 2$ " C3096 Cream sashing strips. For rows 2 and 4, alternate Blocks C and D with sashing strips between. Sew the blocks and sashing strips in each row together.

7. Repeat step 9, sewing the $89 ½$ " C3096 Pine, C3096 Spruce and C4455 Natural strips together for the top/bottom borders. Make two.
8. Mark the center of each border strip along the C3096 Pine side and mark the center of each edge of the quilt top. Matching centers, pin the borders to the quilt top. Stitch each border in place starting and stopping exactly $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ from the quilt top corners. Do not trim the extra border length.

9. Sew a 1" x 66" C3096 Cream sashing strip between adjacent rows. Sew a 1" x 66" C3096 Cream sashing strip to the top and another to the bottom of the quilt center.
10. Sew a 1 " $\times 831 / 2$ " C3096 Cream strip to each side of the quilt center.
11. To make the outer border, sew the $13 / 4 " \times 106^{\prime \prime}$ C3096 Pine inner-border strip, the $2 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 106" C3096 Spruce middleborder strip and the $7 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 106" C4455 Natural outer-border

fig. 4 strip together as shown. Make two side borders.
(figure 4)
12. To miter the borders, fold one corner of the quilt on a $45^{\circ}$ angle so that the border strips are directly on top of one another and the seams nest together. Place your rotary ruler on the fold of the quilt so that the long edge is against the fold and the $45^{\circ}$ line is on the side seam. Draw a line from the corner of the quilt top to the outside edge of the border. Pin the borders together. Position your needle on the inside corner where the border meets the quilt. Stitch directly on the line you have drawn to the outside edge of the border. (figure 5)

Trim the excess fabric leaving a $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowance. Press. Repeat the process for the remaining three corners of the quilt.

## Finishing

13. Layer the quilt top, batting and backing and quilt as desired. 14. Stitch the binding strips together end to end using diagonal seams. Fold and press the resulting long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together. Stitch to the quilt front, matching raw edges and mitering the corners.
14. Fold the binding to the quilt underside and hand-stitch the folded edge to the quilt back.
